

GLC Sustainability Action Group



OLIO is a free mobile app for food-sharing which aims to reduce food waste. OLIO enables surplus food from businesses like Tesco and Iceland to be shared, not thrown away. This could be food nearing its sell-by date in local stores, or bread from the local bakery.

There are approx 100 Volunteers in Thurrock who collect the food waste each night and list it on the app. We are proud to say one of the volunteers is a Herringham Teacher!

Users of the app can request the items for free and collect them from the volunteers. On average there are 100-200 items in each collection the volunteer makes. This includes sandwiches, bread, bakery items, ready meals, salads, meat, veg/fruit.
